SERIES OVERVIEW

When we really understand what happened at the first Christmas, when we really understand who was born, why he came and what he did, we realize we don't have to fight the past. WEEK 1: The Way In: The Right Time Galatians 4:4-7

OVERVIEW	NOTES
In our first message of this series, we are going to help those of us who need God to show up in a strong way in our lives, but for whatever the reason He hasn't yet. We all have those times when we wonder, "Is God asleep? Has He taken a leave of absence? I need God to do something, and I need God to do something now." In the fourth chapter of a book called Galatians, a man by the name of Paul takes us all the way back, not just to the Christmas story, but what happened before the Christmas story. There are three things we can always know is true about God that should give you, not just peace about your present situation, but patience knowing that God will show up. If you are wondering where God is, what God is doing, and when God will act, let the Christmas story remind you of three things that are always true	
KEY POINTS	
1. God Is Waiting For The Best Time For thousands of years, the Jews had been waiting for a messiah. They were looking for a messiah. They were longing for a messiah. The Gentiles had waited on a savior, but a little over two-thousand years ago, on an exact day, an exact month, in an exact year, in an exact place, God said, "The time is now. The wait is over." You see, the reason why God waited is this. God never shows up at a good time and He doesn't show up on our time. He shows up at the best time. So much of life is about waiting and God on His own choices to wait. He is never in a hurry. If you are tired of waiting on the God who waits, don't forget what God is doing while He is waiting. 2. God Is Watching For The Right Time Although we don't know the exact day when Jesus was born, we do know is it a day that God had marked on his calendar. It was a set time. Jesus was never Plan B, and Jesus was no accident. From the time God hung the first planet in space, lit up the sun and put the first breath in a human being, God had this day highlighted in his iPad that said, "Birth of Jesus." When you see the time and the world that Jesus was born into, you realize just how right and perfect it was.	
The timing of Jesus' birth was culturally perfect, politically perfect, and spiritually perfect. God orchestrated so many things to happen so that the atmosphere and the circumstances of humanity at that time were all in the perfect place for Jesus to come. Coincidence? No. Because, while God is waiting for the best time, God is watching for the right time. God and his timing is always perfect.	
3. God Is Working In His Time When God shows up, and He always will and He always does, He shows up in His time to do what is best for you and what is right for you. That is what He does now, and that's what He did back when He sent His Son Jesus

to earth. God is always working and the work that he loves to do, delights to do, and wants to do in every human being is to redeem them from their sin. We did the crime, but Jesus paid the fine. Because of that, we can live in spiritual freedom.	NOTES
So be encouraged. You need God to show up? He will. He always does. You say, "But He is waiting, and He seems to be taking forever." While that may be true, He is also watching, and He is also working. Waiting for the best time, watching for the right time and working in His time.

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WEEK 2: The Way Out: Follow The Leader Colossians 1:15-10

OVERVIEW	NOTES
Unfortunately, we are living in a world where lying is common, practically expected, and seemingly just the way we do business. But at the end of the day, character is still important, and it still matters. It matters not just morally, ethically, and spiritually, but practically. We began by saying that the foundation of character is integrity. In this message, we are going to learn that the first fruit of integrity is honesty. Integrity is more than just honesty, but there can be no integrity without honesty. There is a man in the Bible who exemplified this trait in an incredible way, and that is Samuel. What elevated Samuel, both in the eyes of God and in the eyes of his people was his absolute, unfailing, uncompromising honesty. What distinguished him was not the high positions that he held, but the honest person that he was.	
KEY POINTS	
1. We Worship Jesus As The Lord Of The Universe He calls Jesus the Son, because he wants us to understand he is talking about the human Jesus who was born just like we are, but He wasn't the spitting image of his earthly mother; He was the spitting image of His heavenly father. The Greek word for "image" is the word "eikon" which gives us our word "icon." It refers to a perfect replica, a precise copy, an exact reproduction. The plainest way to say it is, Jesus was God in human flesh. Jesus Christ the Son is just as much God as God the Father.	
Jesus was fully God. He was not fractionally God. He was not partially God; He was fully God. There was a time when Jesus was not a human being. There has never been a time when Jesus was not God. If you need God, you go to Jesus. If you come to God, you come to Jesus. If you love God you love Jesus, because He is fully God.	
That baby who was laid in a manger by the hands of His earthly father was in fact the God who holds the whole world in His hands. In fact, He doesn't just hold you and me in His hands; He holds the whole universe in His hands. He is the glue of the galaxies. He is the cement of creation. He is the Lord of the universe that we worship.	
2. We Follow Jesus As The Leader Of The Church Jesus is the head of the church. He is not just the head of the church, but the head of every church. No believer on earth, no matter what His title may be is the head of the church. The thing with no head is dead and the anything with two heads is a freak. The church only has one head and that is Jesus. The church is called the body and there is a reason for that. A body is to do what the head tells it to do.	
Jesus should have that kind of authority in our lives. And with that authority, He should be our top priority. Jesus should have first place in your life. He

will not take second place. He will never be second in line or second in importance. We follow Jesus as the leader of the church.	NOTES
3. We Come To Jesus As The Link To God Do you know what every human being that has ever been born needs in order to have a relationship with God? Reconciliation. Now do you know what reconciliation is? Reconciliation is the restoration of a relationship. When two people are separated because of their differences they need to be reconciled. Though you didn't realize it at first, from your first breath, you were separated from God by your sinful nature. The only remedy for separation is reconciliation. The moment that Jesus died on the cross, He brought peace between God and humanity and He signed in His blood a peace treaty between God and the world that lasts forever.

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WEEK 3: The Way Up: Son Down To Son Up Philippians 2:5-11

OVERVIEW	NOTES
Have you ever thought about the fact that any religion, any spiritual belief that talks about any heaven or hell always talks about heaven being "up" and hell being "down." You find it all over the Bible. For example, Psalm 14:2 says, "The Lord looks down from heaven on all mankind" You see, Christmas is really just the beginning of a round trip that Jesus took from heaven down to earth and then took back up to heaven. In the second chapter of a letter that Paul wrote called Philippians, Paul describes this round trip. He tells us in this passage that if we do three things, we too can take the way up to heaven.	
KEY POINTS	
1. We Should Conform To The Spirit Of Jesus The entire life of Jesus isn't a story about somebody climbing a ladder; it is a picture of someone coming down a ladder. In eternity, He was at the top of the organizational chart of the universe, but He went from the top to the bottom. In fact, He even went lower than an angel. He became an ordinary human being and He wasn't born in a palace to a king and a queen but laid in a manger as a pheasant son of a poverty-stricken couple. From the time that He was born until He died, He spent His entire life doing two things: obeying God and serving others.	
Paul says we ought to have that same mindset. We are not God, but we can be gracious. We are not heavenly, but we can be humble. We are not sovereigns, but we can be servants. When you are on the way up, you will think the way Jesus did, and you will live the way Jesus lived.	
2. We Must Confirm The Sacrifice Of Jesus Let me ask you some questions. If you were the God of the universe would you leave your throne in heaven and come to earth so you could sleep on the straw surrounded by stinking animals from abreast just so you could live and even have the indignity of having your diaper changed? If you knew that the vast majority of people you came for would reject you, would you still come? If you knew that the tongues that you created would curse you, the mouths that you created would spit on you, the hands you created would crucify you, would you still come?	
Look at what Jesus did about sacrifice. He gave up a crown for a cross. He gave up adoration for humiliation. He gave up sovereignty for suffering. He went from sitting on a throne, to laying in a manger, to hanging on a tree. He went from being a king with a crown, to a baby with diapers, to an accused criminal on a cross. Why did he do that? Because, your soul was more important than his blood. Your eternal life was more important than His earthly life. Your place in heaven was more important than His place in heaven. He gave up His place so you could have a place.	

WEEK 3: The Way Up: Son Down To Son Up Philippians 2:5-11
